PRINCIPAL'S REPORT

Year Six Market - The market is coming up on Friday 9th September. For our Year Six students it is an activity that they really look forward to organising. The students (after sessions with the teachers) get together in groups and present their idea for a stall or activity to a panel (shark tank style). With support from the Year Six teachers, they ensure they have a mix of activities, food stalls and craft stalls. The school provides each group with seed funding for their stall. This cross-curriculum inquiry unit covers many areas of the Victorian Curriculum, Mathematics, English, Design and Technology, Economics and Business and the Capabilities of Critical and Creative Thinking and Personal and Social Capabilities. The students always do an amazing job running the market for all the students across the school to enjoy. We very much appreciate the support of the Year Six student's parents who behind the scenes are supporting the market. We are hoping for good weather and to connect to the Year Six Inquiry Unit for Term Three. Further information in the newsletter and was sent as a Compass post to parents and carers yesterday.

Coming Events - We realise that there are several events coming up in September and we bundled the Father's Day Breakfast, Footy Day, and Year Six Market into one Compass post so that hopefully you do not miss a post for one of these. Story Dogs Fundraiser - Thank you to everyone for supporting the fundraiser last Friday. Details of the total raised is on the SRC page in the newsletter. There were lots of creative costumes worn by students and staff. The students provided smiles and laughs in their copycat outfits of some of the staff members and acting ability to portray their version of the staff traits. We were all excited that Paddy (one of our story dogs) who was missing since Sunday night was back with his family on Wednesday morning. Thank you again for the support in looking for Paddy.

Wellbeing Resources - After two years of Covid lockdowns and periods of Remote Learning there is an increase across schools in Victoria of families looking for support and resources to support children's mental health and wellbeing. Parent Opinion Survey 2021 - In August 2021 we sent the Parent Opinion Survey out to our whole school community. We had 111 families complete the survey. This along with the Attitudes to School Survey Years 4 - 6 and Staff Opinion Survey are some of the sources of data that we use to inform the school's focus on continuous improvement. This data, along with Student Achievement Data, NAPLAN, program reviews the goals and targets in the Strategic Plan, Department of Education's improvement agenda and the latest education research on best practise in teaching and learning, inform the development of the Annual Implementation Plan.

PRINCIPAL'S REPORT continued

Data from the 2021 Parent Opinion Survey is reported on in the Annual Report, which is available on the school's website. The data sets are analysed by the School Leadership Team, in various forums with staff and at School Council Meetings. In the newsletter we have highlighted areas we have focused on improving this year. One of the discussions has been about providing clarity on the ways we communicate with parents and their purpose. Below is a table describing some of the modes of communication we use. We will continue to improve the modes of communication that we use to ensure they are effective and meet the needs of our school community.

2022 Surveys - Our Year 4 - 6 recently completed the Attitudes to School Survey. Currently students in Year 4 - 6 who have this year been involved in our Learning Boost Program are completing the Department of Education Tutor Learning Initiative Survey. Staff have the Staff Opinion Survey coming up later this month. The 2022 Parent Opinion Survey will be available from next Monday 15th August. We are inviting all school families to complete the survey. All families will receive a Compass post on Monday with further details and your individual login details. Areas of strengths and those that require further exploration or focus with be reported back to the school community when all data is received from Department of Education.

Mount Martha Primary School Modes of Communication			
COMPASS	Compass is our communication platform for whole school /year level/class communication, consent, schedule of event, student wellbeing and attendance, reminders, parent payments, student information/ reporting/management, link to Banksia Bulletin, bookings for school events and during remote learning links to Webex sessions and student learning tasks.		
BLOGS	Classroom and Specialist BLOGS are opportunities for teachers/students to share learning experiences with our school community. Members of our school community may comment or pose a question for the class to respond to.		
Email/Phone Calls	Discuss student learning, wellbeing, ask questions, provide feedback, raise concerns, share thoughts and suggestions.		
Banksia Bulletin	Overview of school activities, upcoming events, principal report, highlighting student achievement, information from Department of Education, teaching and learning activities, reminders of recent Compass Posts, SEC events, working bees, local community activities and advertising.		
School and Year Level Assemblies	The Year Six Leadership Teams run these. It is an opportunity for student to perform, share learning and acknowledge student achievement.		
Seesaw	Prep to Year Four are using Seesaw to share individual student's learning. It provides parents/carers with samples of their child's work and can provide a prompt to discuss with children what they have been learning and their learning goals. Year Four also use this to set homework tasks and for students upload their work. In Remote Learning, tasks were uploaded into Seesaw, students returned their work to teachers in Seesaw for teacher feedback.		
Google Classroom	Google classroom is used at school with students from Years 3 - 6. Teachers in Years 5 & 6 will send a Compass post to parents and carers highlighting learning task to view and discuss with your child.		
Before/After School	Staff are available to speak with parents/carers at school drop off or pick up time.		
Parent Teacher Interviews	Staff are available for parents to make an appointment to discuss any concerns, student learning or to answer any questions you may have.		
Student Led Conferences	After the Semester One reports have been provided to parents/carers we have Student Led Conferences. Students will share their learning and learning goals for Semester Two.		
Student Support Group Meetings	Meetings to support students learning and wellbeing. At times discussion with parents/carers of Individual Educational Plan, Behaviour Support Plan.		
School Council/ Social Events Committee	Both groups are representatives of our school community. Establishing the broad direction and vision of the school within the school's community. Informing itself and consider any views of the school community for the purpose of making. decisions regarding the school and the students at the school. Stimulate interest in the school in the wider community.


YEAR 6 MARKET NEWS
