### PRINCIPAL'S REPORT

Thank you again parents for your help in limiting the transference of COVID-19 at school and in the community. Please see important information in the newsletter about the rapid antigen testing program which is now an option in the event of a COVID exposure at school.

Welcome back our to Year 2 students who are now onsite after a period of quarantine. Our best wishes continue to our families as they manage this situation.

As the term progresses we are reviewing our activities to see what we can run unchanged, run with modification or, unfortunately have had to cancel. It is great to see some of our activities returning to our calendar!

**Reminder: Final Pupil Free Day 2021** - A reminder that **Friday 3<sup>rd</sup> December** is a Pupil Free Day for Mount Martha Primary School. No students are required to attend. Out of School Hours Care are running a program on the day. Teachers will be focussing on an audit of curriculum to determine which areas were impacted by remote learning. This information will then be made available to the next Year level as a focus for teaching and learning in Term 1 2022 and when those units are covered in the year. Teachers will also be undertaking follow up work on the school values for inclusion in our wellbeing program next year.

**Remembrance Day** - Today Thursday 11<sup>th</sup> November at 11am the signing of the armistice that brought World War One to an end was commemorated. A service was conducted at Memorial Park in Mornington. A wreath was laid on behalf of the school community at Memorial Park in Mornington by Tia 6D and Jai 6B. ## RAPID ANTIGEN TESTING PROGRAM

The Therapeutic Goods Administration (TGA) approved the use of rapid antigen testing for home use from Monday 1 November.

The Department of Education and Training (DET) is currently working with the Department of Health to roll-out a state-wide program for any new COVID-19 exposures on school sites from Monday 15 November. This program will help unvaccinated or partially vaccinated students to return to school as quickly as possible after being identified as a primary close contact (PCC) after a seven-day quarantine, instead of a 14-day quarantine.

A pilot program is currently underway in 20 schools in the state. DET will have more information for parents and carers at the conclusion of the pilot ahead of the statewide roll-out, including factsheets, web copy, video content and other materials to assist with the program.

### How the rapid antigen testing program will work

Following an exposure at our school, you will be notified that your child (who is unvaccinated, or partially vaccinated) has been identified as primary close contact (PCC) of a confirmed COVID-19 case.

The at-home rapid antigen testing program is an opt-in program for unvaccinated, or partially vaccinated, students. Our school will provide you with rapid antigen test kits. You do not need to buy these test kits.

If you want to take part in the at-home rapid antigen testing program, your child must quarantine at home for seven days. Day one of quarantine is first day of quarantine after your child's last potential contact with a confirmed case. On day six of quarantine, your child must get a standard (PCR) test at your local COVID-19 testing site. If the test is negative, you must provide the results to your child's school, and your child can then return to school on day eight after completing seven days of quarantine.

Students will then be required to return a negative rapid antigen test result each morning from days eight to 14 on school days, which must be reported to the school by 8:30am before they arrive at school.

If you do not opt into the Rapid Antigen Testing Program your child must quarantine at home for 14 days. On day 13 of quarantine, your child must get a standard (PCR) test at your local testing site. If the PCR test is negative, you must provide the results to school. Your child can then return to school on day 15 without undergoing a rapid antigen test.

Parents should continue to follow current school policy and public health advice. If your child is unwell, even with the mildest of symptoms, they must stay at home and get tested for COVID-19 with a standard (PCR) test, regardless of a negative rapid antigen test result.

Our school will communicate with you as soon as we are able that we have a confirmed COVID-19 case, including with instructions on how to conduct these tests, how to report the results, and support available if needed.

This pilot, and later statewide roll-out of rapid antigen testing is one of many strategies currently in place to support schools during the COVID-19 pandemic. ## ARRANGEMENTS FOR ONSITE LEARNING (Updated - see point 12)

Some important points to note:

1. A critical measure in control of COVID-19 in schools is that unwell students should not be sent to school or remain at school if symptoms appear during the day or they become unwell. Parents will be contacted to collect unwell students who will be supervised while isolated from other students.
2. Face masks must be worn by students in Years 3 to 6 when indoors at school and recommended for students in Prep to Year 2.
3. If a student or staff member is diagnosed with COVID-19 the school will contact the Department of Education and Training (DET) who will direct the school in the next steps including provision of timelines and communication templates. The Regional Director determines whether the school will be shut to allow time for contact tracing and cleaning. Schools are required to follow the direction of DET in for action required, communication and timelines. Department of Health provides health advice to families. Testing and isolation of primary close contacts for a period of time is usually required.
4. The school day will commence at 9am as usual with students usually arriving at different times from about 8.30am. Please follow the "Kiss and Go" rules. This staggered arrival allows for a flow of students entering and easier physical distancing. At the end of the day, students in Prep to Year 1 will finish at 3.30pm. Year 2 will also finish at 3.30pm when back onsite. Years 3 to Year 6 will finish school at 3.20pm. A slightly earlier finish will allow an improved flow of students off site while still allowing siblings to meet if required for the walk home.
5. Siblings should have a pre-arranged and clearly understood outside meeting place if travelling home together.
6. Once a year level has returned, all students will be expected to attend school as normal. This means if a parent/carer chooses to keep their child/children home after their year level has returned to on-site schooling, the remote learning program does not continue. This does not apply to children who need to be absent for health, medical reasons or exceptional circumstances. For those families, please contact us so we can make an appropriate plan.
7. Students may choose to bring their own named water bottle. Drinking bottles can be refilled from taps during the day. Food is not to be shared.
8. A rigorous approach will be used by teachers to ensure all students wash/sanitise their hands each time upon entry and exit of rooms, before and after eating, after using the toilet and after coughing or sneezing. Students will be reminded of the need to cough or sneeze into their elbow and use tissues. All classrooms have handwashing and/or sanitiser available, tissues and antiseptic wipes. Parents may choose to supply their own child with sanitiser and tissues. Increased ventilation strategies are applied.
9. Enhanced cleaning of the school particularly including high touch points and toilets will be undertaken.
10. The Chief Health Officer has highlighted the importance of social distancing between adults as a key control measure and must continue to be practiced. Social distancing is not required amongst students onsite. Parents are encouraged to only be onsite for essential business. Parents must not enter classrooms or corridors. Communication with teachers will continue to be via Gmail and telephone. The Office is open but social distancing is required. Early pick ups or late arrivals will be organised from the Office. Parents must not congregate at the school gates and must practice social distancing. Parents are encouraged to wait offsite at drop off and pick up. We recognise that in the initial days of returning to school some students, particularly Preps, may require a parent to walk them in to school or a pick up but over time we should all be working to minimise this.
11. Essential visitors to school grounds must comply with density limits, face mask requirements, QR code/Compass Kiosk/manual check ins and practise respiratory etiquette and good hand hygiene.
12. Parent volunteers must show proof of being double vaccinated prior to their assistance in school events.
13. We have also made changes to the way our staff work and have breaks to ensure social distancing as well.
14. Designated play equipment and areas already exist for our students and oval use is timetabled. This together with a large play area will mean that recess and lunchtimes will remain at their usual times. Close contacts are also now defined as accumulated close contact of greater than 2 hours.

## YEAR 6 MARKET

### ***Handy Market Hints:***

- *Bring along a reusable bag to carry any products or prizes and a pouch/wallet for their tokens.*
- *Encourage your child to do some extra jobs around the house to earn the \$10 to buy their Market Pack on Compass.*

### ***Frequently Asked Questions:***

Q: Have all Covid safety measures been addressed?

A: In this ever changing environment, if anything falls outside the scope of a permitted activity, that activity will be cancelled. Each activity will have a Covid Safety Plan (where appropriate this will include masks, gloves, sanitiser etc.), Classes will be remaining in their Year Level Bubble. The cooking of food will be supervised and served from the canteen window.

Q: What sort of prizes can be won?

A: Occasionally the prize is simply participating! For example one stall allows you to race a friend through an obstacle course allowing the winner to reach a water pistol first, and you guessed it!! They get to squirt their friend!! Many other stalls have prizes ranging from things such as tattoos, basketballs and some great surprises!

Q: I heard there will be a stall offering Pet Rocks. Will they sell food to feed their Pet Rocks?

A: Pet Rocks live on a diet of soil and SodaStream Soda. Providing your soil at home isn't too saline you will be able to simply feed it from your garden bed. We do not sell SodaStreams.

Q: Can I purchase additional tokens.

A: No. Each year level will have the opportunity to visit the market for about 50minutes. The allocated amount of tokens per Market Pack should be enough for them to enjoy throughout this time. Talk to your child about using 1 or 2 tokens to purchase a treat, 1 or 2 for a small item of craft and then to use the remaining 10 on their favourite 5 activities! LOOK OUT THOUGH!! 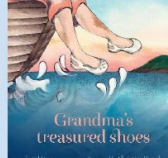
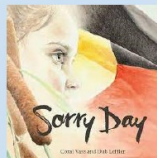
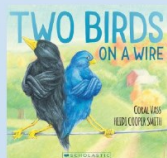
