PRINCIPAL'S REPORT

2022 Annual Implementation Plan is posted on the Mount Martha Primary School website <https://www.mtmarthaps.vic.edu.au> under the "Information" tab. Each four years schools undergo a school review from an external reviewer and a panel including school staff, parents, students, the school's Senior Educational Improvement Leader and Principals from two other schools. The review assisting in the writing of the school's four-year Strategic Plan. This has the school's goals focused on areas of improvement. Each year the school writes an Annual Implementation Plan to work towards achieving the goals and targets of the Strategic Plan. The plan provides information on the school's areas of focus for the 2022 school year.

Year 4 Camp - Our Year 4's students are at Arrabri Lodge Camp at Warburton and will return tomorrow. Thank you to staff and parent helpers for attending. We are sure they will have many exciting stories to tell about their adventures and experiences over the weekend.

Year 5 Camp - Our Year 5 students are off to spend three exciting days at Sovereign Hill in Ballarat on Monday 30th May and returning Wednesday 1st June. Currently in class as part of their inquiry unit they are studying "From Colony to Democracy" with a focus on the gold rush of the 1850's. This week they begin their gold rush game with lots of activities for students to understand life in the 1850's. The camp at Sovereign Hill will consolidate student's understandings and bring their learning to "life". We hope they all enjoy this fantastic experience.

School Cross Country - Unfortunately due to expected poor weather with storms the school cross country was postponed. The weather on the day did not end up as predicted by the weather bureau. It is now planned for Monday 16th May. We all have our fingers crossed for fantastic weather.

KNOWLEDGE INTEGRITY COLLABORATION RESPECT

For the next four weeks we will focus on one of our school values. This is to let you know at home the expectations from school, as well as what each value looks like at school, how we have defined them in student friendly language and what you can do to help keep the conversation going at home.

This week we start with Integrity. This is often a hard word to define, at MMPS we say that **integrity is doing the right thing in the right way at all times, even if it is hard or no one is looking.** Put simply it is the quality of being honest.

We expect that students that are established in their ability to show integrity are able to say:

- I can be fair, honest and respectful in what I say and what I do.
- I can act in the best interest of my community.
- I can treat everyone the way I would like to be treated.
- I can accept responsibility for my actions.
- I can be the best version of myself.
- I can choose not to be a bystander.

Integrity can look like many things at school. In the classroom, it is all of the actions that a student takes to show their teacher that they are someone that can be easily trusted. In the yard it may be as simple as choosing to pick up that chip packet rather than walking over it or it may be respectfully calling out an action of another as inappropriate.

Outside of school integrity is often rebranded as sportsmanship or mateship. Any team activity like dance or soccer will encourage students to work together and always act in the best interest of their team. This is the easier part of integrity. The trickier part of integrity is acting in the best interest of *everyone* in your sporting match. Obviously we don't expect students to begin to kick goals for the other team, however there is no reason why they can't be encouraging toward the other team and possibly even admit, when it's all over, that the other team was in fact playing better than their team. "My sports team is not always the best sports team" is just not something we hear very often... At home integrity is usually linked with initiative, cleaning up without prompting, helping younger siblings etc.

Our school values are closely linked with empathy. Students that are able to look beyond their own self interest and act in the best interest of their community — whether that be their classroom, sports team, friendship group, school or family — show an established understanding of integrity.

So how can the school and home work together to foster and encourage integrity and other important values? One, be very explicit about exactly what integrity looks like and let our students know when we see them acting in a way that shows integrity, while explaining how proud we are of them. Two, ensure that we are demonstrating integrity in everything that we do. Are students seeing adults that walk past the rubbish in the school yard or the beach? Are we able to admit that our sports team is not always the best sports team? One of the greatest demonstrations of integrity is the ability to admit and possibly apologise when we are wrong. Increasing the ability to show integrity will have many positive impacts including happier students, safer students, more confident students and the reduction of bullying. In a world where everyone is showing integrity, bullying simply does not exist. Continue to talk to your students about how they demonstrate integrity.

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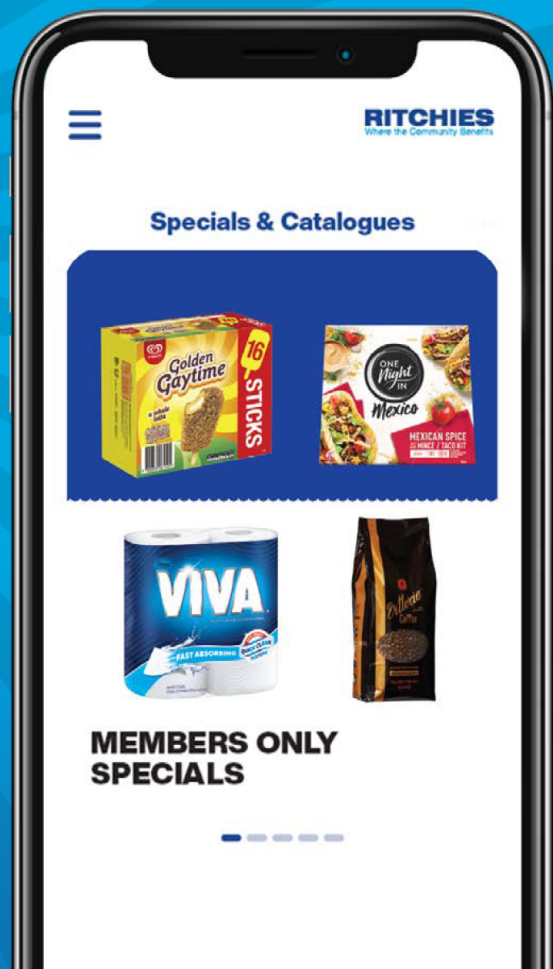
