#### PRINCIPAL'S REPORT

Changes in School Crossing Times - The Mornington Shire Council Community Safety Officers have advised that there is still a lot of traffic leaving and students arriving just past 9am on the school crossing outside the school. The council safety officers regularly visit school crossings and our school crossing supervisor Robyn. In the interests of the safety of our school community the council is changing the operational hours of the crossing in the mornings from 8am to 9am to 8.10am to 9.10am. There are no changes to the afternoon and the crossing is supervised from 3pm-4pm. Classroom teachers will discuss these changes with their students. Please discuss with your children that Robyn will not be on the crossing until 8.10am if they are crossing before this time. The changes will come into effect from Monday 17th October.

Road Safety - We have had reports from members of our community that there are some students walking on the road in Glenisla Drive between Normanby Terrace and Dominion Road. Also, on Orana Drive only moving out of the way at the last minute to let cars passed and then moving back onto the road. Concerns were also raised about cars doing u turns outside the school and the speed of cars in Eco Park. These concerns have been raised with the safety and wellbeing of our students. Please reinforce road safety with your children. Class teachers and our Travel Smart Leaders will reinforce road safety with students at school. Thankyou for your support and assistance.

**Uniform** - Summer is on the way and so it is timely to revisit the summer uniform requirements. They may be found on the school website <a href="http://mtmarthaps.vic.edu.au/">http://mtmarthaps.vic.edu.au/</a> under the "Policies" tab or in the Parent Information Booklet under the "Parents" tab. A reminder that while non uniform jumpers/hoodies may be worn to and from school they are not part of the school uniform and so should not be worn while the students are at school. Thank you for your assistance. A reminder that if your child has lost an item, please visit the Lost Property area near the Art Room.

**PLC Term 4 Focus** - From the goal in our School's Strategic Plan to increase the number of students performing above the expected level in Number and Algebra, our whole school focus as a Professional Learning Community this term is to improve student outcomes in Number and Algebra through differentiation practices. Each year level has further broken this goal down into a specific goal for their team. Teams will be using student's Essential Assessment Data to focus on differentiating to target the individual learning needs of students. Students will set learning goals and work towards achieving these by being involved in differentiated open ended tasks with enabling and extending prompts. This focus will build on the work students and staff completed in Term Three on student's learning disposition in mathematics.

#### PRINCIPAL'S REPORT continued

Changes to COVID Settings in School - You may be aware that the Victorian Government has announced changes to the COVID-19 isolation requirements. This means that from yesterday at 11.59pm on Wednesday 12 October, the mandatory orders around isolation for people with COVID-19 have ended and instead we move to health advice and recommendations for people with COVID-19 or COVID-19-like symptoms. Our school will continue to adhere to the Department of Health's recommendations to ensure that our school remains a safe environment for our staff and students.

The Department of Health strongly recommends that students and school staff:

- who test positive to COVID-19 stay home and isolate for five days and do not attend school after five days if they are still symptomatic
- who are symptomatic but have not tested positive not attend school. This does not include students with pre-existing conditions such as hay fever.

Parents and carers are recommended to continue to report their child having COVID-19 to both the school and the Department of Health.

We will, however, no longer report occurrences of positive cases to the school community. We ask parents and carers to continue to remain vigilant in preventing COVID-19 transmission. Any student who is unwell should continue to remain at home. This is about keeping students healthy and well in our school and reducing the spread of both COVID-19 and other respiratory diseases. Free Rapid Antigen Tests are available at the school for those who need them. Parents and carers will be contacted if their child shows symptoms while at school. Students who wish to wear a mask should continue to do so. To keep our school as safe as possible, we will also continue to use air purifiers and other COVID-19 prevention measures. Thanks for your continued efforts to keep our school community safe and well.

Year Three Camp - Our Year Three students, staff and a fantastic group of parent volunteers are heading "all the way" to the Briars Camp on Monday next week for three days of exciting activities. We hope you all have a wonderful time on your first camp and look forward hearing about your adventures after camp.

**Prep 2023 Information Night** - Next week on Wednesday night we have the next in a series of activities for Parents of our 2023 Prep students. The session will run from 7.00pm - 8.30pm and provides parents/carers with an insight into how they can support their child's transition into school. A highlight of the evening is a fashion parade of the school uniform by some of this year's Prep students.

**Somers Camp -** Next week we have ten students who are heading to the nine-day district camp at Somers. This camp will have 160 students from our network attending. We all hope they have a wonderful time.

Class Splits - Late last term, the school had to decide to split grades for Term 4 when classroom teachers are absent. With higher than anticipated staff absences (due to the COVID pandemic) the Casual Relief Teacher (CRT) budget has been expended for 2022. We know this decision is not ideal, but we are confident that all children in the school will continue to receive best practice in teaching and learning if their class has been split.

#### **Recap of Previous Newsletter Articles**

**Student Groupings - Planning for 2023** - It is approaching the time of the year when the teachers begin to consider class groupings for the next year. Certain information is helpful in this process and parents, who believe that exceptional educational circumstances exist for their child/ren that should be considered in placement for next year, need to forward the information in writing to the Principal by Friday 28<sup>th</sup> October. Whilst parents are assured that this information will be considered, no guarantee for individuals is possible as the decisions made are the best for all students collectively.
