PRINCIPAL'S REPORT

Return to On Site Learning

With two days to go for our remote learning program I would again like to congratulate our students, parents/carers and staff for all your work in the remote learning program. Everyone has risen to the challenges of remote learning magnificently. We are looking forward to having our students in Year 3, Year 4, Year 5 and Year 6 join us back at school on **Tuesday 9th June**. Congratulations to our students in Prep, Year 1 and Year 2 for a very successful return to onsite learning. Classes are very settled with students adapting to our new routines.

A focus with all our students as they return to school has been to prioritise activities to assist the students to settle back in and re-establish relationships. With the health and wellbeing of our students always a priority, teachers will be monitoring the students as we are conscious that students may have a variety of feelings about returning to school.

A reminder that once a year level has returned, all students will be expected to attend school as normal. This means if a parent/carer chooses to keep their child/children home after their year level has returned to on-site schooling, we can no longer support their learning from home. This does not apply to children who need to be absent for health or medical reasons. For those families, please contact us so we can make an appropriate plan.

Return of Loaned Computers - Year 3 to Year 6 borrowed Laptops are required to be returned either after lunch on Friday 5th June or during Office hours on Tuesday 9th June. This will allow students to access computers in classrooms as soon as possible and our normal teaching program to resume.

"Transition to Onsite Parent and Carers Handbook"- With the imminent return of students in Years 3 to 6 information may now be a higher priority for parents with students in those year levels. It is included with today's post. Please read as it contains important information about the return to school. Information is based on recommendations from Victoria's Chief Medical Officer and DET with a view to limiting transference of COVID-19 and applies to all members of our school community.

Some key points concerning the return to school:

- Unwell students should <u>not</u> be sent to school or remain at school if symptoms appear during the day or they become unwell. Parents will be contacted to collect unwell students who will be supervised while isolated from other students.
- Social distancing between adults is a key control measure and must continue to be practiced. Social distancing is not required amongst students when onsite. Parents are encouraged to only be onsite for essential business. Parents must not enter classrooms or corridors. Communication with teachers will continue to be via gmail and telephone. The Office is open but social distancing is required. Early pickups or late arrivals will be organised from the Office. Parents must wait offsite at drop off and pick up and not congregate at the school gates. We recognise that in the initial days of returning to school some students may require a parent to walk them in to school or a pick up but we should all be working to minimise this.

Our Mission is to ensure high quality and engaging learning program that builds on the capability of every student.

Principal Report continued

- The school day will commence at 9am as usual with students usually arriving at different times from about 8.30am. This staggered arrival allows for a flow of students entering and easier physical distancing. Please follow the "Kiss and Go" rules.
- At the end of the day, students in Years **3 to Year 6 will finish school** at <u>3.20pm</u>. Students in Prep to Year 2 will finish at **3.30pm as usual.** A slightly earlier finish will allow an improved flow of students off site while still allowing siblings to meet if required for the walk home. Siblings should have a pre-arranged and clearly understood outside meeting place if travelling home together.
- Designated play equipment and areas already exist for our students and oval use is timetabled. This together with a large play area will mean that recess and lunchtimes will remain at their usual times.
- Students should bring their own named water bottle as drinking fountains are not available.
- Teachers will work to ensure all students wash/sanitise their hands each time upon entry and exit of rooms, before and after eating, after using the toilet and after coughing or sneezing. Students will be reminded of the need to cough or sneeze into their elbow and use tissues. All classrooms have handwashing and/or sanitiser available, tissues and antiseptic wipes. Parents may choose to supply their own child with sanitiser and tissues.
- Enhanced and additional cleaning of high touch points and toilets is provided. Playground equipment will also be cleaned.

Thank you for your assistance in implementation of these strategies. It starts with reading the information provided in the handbook. This will assist in keeping our school community safe.

As we have seen recently in the media in a school setting if a student or staff member is diagnosed with COVID-19 the school will contact the Department of Health who will advise the next steps. It is likely the school will be shut and reopen after a deep clean has occurred. This takes usually between 1 and 3 days.

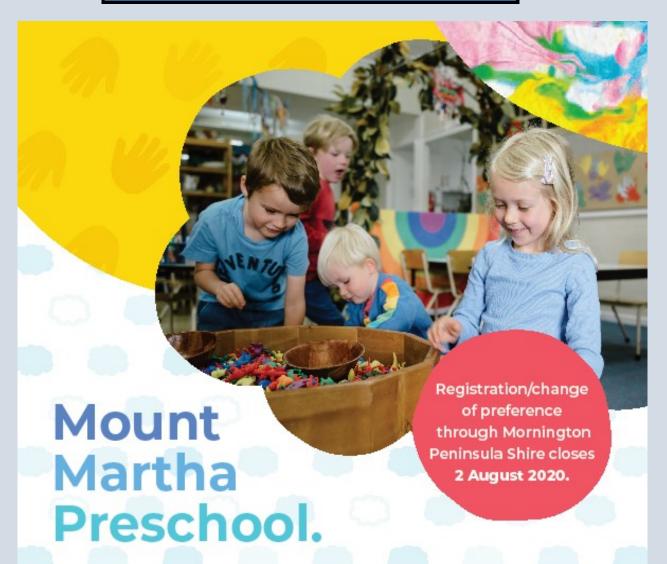
