PRINCIPAL'S REPORT

Return to On Site Learning.

Congratulations to all our students for a very successful return to onsite learning on Monday. Students were glad to be back at school seeing their teachers and friends and engaging in learning back at school. They are quickly settling in and adapting to some important new routines. Teachers have been prioritising activities to assist in the transition back to school and re-establishing relationships as part of a focus on our students' wellbeing.

Once again I would like to thank parents and carers for all of your work in delivering the remote learning program. Teaching can be challenging at the best of times and your work engaging with your children and the teachers was fantastic!

"Transition to Onsite Parent and Carers Handbook". A reminder that the handbook contains important information about the return to school and current protocols. It has previously been sent out on Compass. Information is based on recommendations from Victoria's Chief Medical Officer and DET with a view to limiting transference of COVID-19 and applies to all members of our school community.

A reminder that:

- Unwell students should <u>not</u> be sent to school or remain at school if symptoms appear
 during the day or they become unwell. Parents will be contacted to collect unwell
 students who will be supervised while isolated from other students.
- Social distancing between adults is a key control measure and must continue to be practiced. Parents are encouraged to only be onsite for essential business. Parents must not enter classrooms or corridors, must wait offsite at drop off and pick up and not congregate at the school gates. In the initial days of returning to school some students may require a parent to walk them in to school or a pick up but we should all be working to minimise this. Initial communication with teachers will still be via the teachers' gmail and phone numbers used in the remote learning program.
- The school day will commence at **9am** as usual. Please follow the "Kiss and Go" rules.
- At the end of the day, Years 3 to Year 6 will finish school at <u>3.20pm</u>. Students in Prep to Year 2 will finish at 3.30pm as usual. Siblings should have a pre-arranged and clearly understood outside meeting place if travelling home together.
- Students should bring their own named water bottle as drinking fountains are not available.

Thank you for your assistance in implementation of these strategies. This will assist in keeping our school community safe.

Certain information is helpful in this process and parents, who believe that exceptional educational circumstances exist for their child/ren that should be considered in placement for next year, need to forward the information in writing to the principal by Friday 31st October. Whilst parents are assured that this information will be considered, no guarantee for individuals is possible as the decisions made are the best for all students collectively.

VICTORIAN HIGH - ABILITY PROGRAM NEWS

Victorian High-Ability Program

This year the Department of Education introduced a student excellence program called the Victorian High-Ability Program (VHAP). The VHAP will provide up to 48,000 high-ability students in Years 5 to 8 at government schools across the state with the opportunity to participate in 10-week online extension and enrichment programs, in English and Mathematics.

The virtual program, delivered by Virtual School Victoria, will focus on extending and developing students' mathematic and English abilities.

After completing the virtual program, students will participate in a masterclass with other high-ability students from schools in their local area. All masterclasses will incorporate the latest COVID-19 advice and risk mitigation strategies to maintain a safe environment for students and staff.


The Department is centrally managing the selection process for the program based on student academic performance. Parents of students selected for the program have been provided with more information about the program and started their experience last week online!

The innovative parking signs around our community are aimed at improving safety for those who walk, ride, skate and scoot to school. In addition, these zones greatly assist with traffic congestion and road safety issues around our school.

Park and Stride:

This zone was an initiative designed in consultation with the Mount Martha School Community. Park and Stride routes have been chosen based on site viability, natural surveillance of routes and where our families live. Park and Stride is currently available from **Mt Martha House** and just outside **Via Sole Pizza** on Walara Drive.

Kiss & Go:

This zone is a pick up and drop off zone. The idea is that the driver remains in the car, the children exit **kerbside** where you can just kiss them and go freeing up the space for others.
