### PRINCIPAL'S REPORT

**End of Term 3 & Term 4** - We would like to wish all our families a safe, relaxing, and happy school holiday break. We are looking forward to a busy Term Four with lots of interesting and engaging teaching and learning activities, as our students work towards achieving their learning goals.

During Term Three the whole school focus as a Professional Learning Community was to improve students' attitudes to Math's by developing their knowledge of learning dispositions. Last night the teachers met to review the pre and post survey data from students, reflect on teaching and learning throughout this cycle, what high impact teaching strategies (HITS) were most effective and what can be embedded in our practices in the future.

Next term the focus will be on improving student outcomes in Number and Algebra through differentiation practices. Each year level team will make this a more specific goal and in a cycle of continuous improvement focus on HITS, student goal setting, assessment and differentiated practises to target the needs of students.

Thank you to everyone for your support as we continued to juggle COVID cases in the community. It has been wonderful to have had three terms of school without Remote Learning. We do appreciate the challenges for everyone who has isolated at times. To ensure the safety and well-being of staff and students, the Victorian Government will continue to provide schools with Rapid Antigen Tests in Term 4. The policy requires the tests to be used by students when symptomatic or considered to be a household contact of a positive case (that is, they have spent more than 4 hours with someone who has COVID-19 inside a house). Test packs are available for collection from the First Aid Office at the school throughout Term Four if your family requires them. Any student or staff member who tests positive to COVID-19 must now isolate for a minimum of 5 days instead of 7. If asymptomatic, they may return on day 6.

**Footy Day** - How lucky we were to have glorious sunshine for our Footy Day yesterday! Thankyou to Cameron Sweatman for organising a fun filled parade and goal kicking competition. Such a colourful spectacle with everyone dressed in the colours of their AFL team, sporting uniform or colours of a team followed in another sporting code. Thank you to the wonderful SEC for organising the Footy Donuts that were a delicious addition to our students' lunches after the activities. We all really appreciate the effort and commitment of this group in running events and activities that bring our school community together, providing special memories for our students and raise valuable funds to improve the school facilities. 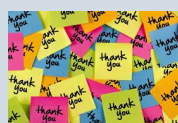

- All Packs will be **Home Delivered** to your nominated delivery address during December/January.
- Orders **must be placed by the due date** in order to guarantee delivery before the first day of Term 1.
- Orders placed after the due date **may not be processed until early February** due to our extremely busy schedule in January.  
We will do our best to deliver your order in time, but is only **guaranteed** if placed by the due date. We apologise if you are a new enrollment or missed the due date due to unavoidable circumstances but the school is aware your pack may not be ready on the first day of school, so your child should not be disadvantaged.
- A packaging and delivery charge of \$8 is included in the cost of the pack. Orders placed after the due date will incur an additional \$8 late fee.
- Complete packs only can be ordered through Paperchase. We do not have a walk-in shop and individual items cannot be purchased. All orders must be placed online.

## SPORTS NEWS

### **NATIONAL INTERSCHOOL SNOWSPORTS CHAMPIONSHIP**

Cole represented Mt Martha Primary School in Giant Slalom – snowboarder & Boardercross. Cole came second receiving silver medals in both events and went onto represent Mt Martha Primary School & Victoria at Perisher in NSW for the National Interschool Snowsports Championships.

At the National Championships in Perisher, over 1500 competitors from 291 schools competed over the week, Mt Martha Primary School being one of them! When he registered the event organiser said “that must be a long way away I’ve never heard of it!” The National Championships saw Cole compete in the Giant Slalom event again. He had two races in which they combine your time. Cole came 4<sup>th</sup> overall in this event only 0.04 seconds behind 2<sup>nd</sup> and 3<sup>rd</sup> place. He also came 8<sup>th</sup> in the Boardercross event out of 100 competitors in his age group.

It was a great experience and Cole hopes next year Mt Martha Primary School might have other keen skiers and snowboarders that might like to join him in the 2023 Victorian Snowsport Championships.

### **LOCAL SPORTING FINALS**

Over the weekend we had a huge amount of our students playing in their domestic Grand Finals in multiple sports. I was fortunate to go and watch a nail biting Basketball Grand Final which could’ve gone into overtime with a shot on the buzzer but the boys played so well and showed great sportsmanship. ## Please look after the short-finned eels in our Balcombe Estuary

We write this article to bring awareness to our community about the short-finned eel that lives in our backyard, the Balcombe Estuary. After the short-finned eel is born in the South Pacific Ocean, it goes on a hard, long journey where it overcomes many dangers. The journey starts from its birthplace in the Coral Sea and when they get to the Estuary, they are only half way through this epic journey.

When they arrive at the Balcombe Estuary, they swim upstream and adapt to the freshwater environment. The eels live upstream for up to 20 years and during this time, they mature to a point where they are almost ready to head back to their original home in the Coral Sea.

A year before they head back, they go downstream towards the point where the estuary meets the ocean, where they spend a year adapting to the salt water. This is the most important part of their journey because if they enter the ocean before they are mature, they will die. They instinctively know when the time is right and they go through the S-bend where the estuary flows into the ocean. When they get back to the Coral Sea, they spawn and then die, and the life cycle starts again.

Sadly people have recently been digging trenches at the S-bend and this confuses the eels into thinking that it is time to make the journey back to the Coral Sea. This is a tragedy because the eels will die if they leave the estuary before they are ready.

We want to bring awareness to our community and plead with you - don't dig trenches! We know this may be a fun thing to do at the beach, but please think about our wonderful eels before you start digging a trench.

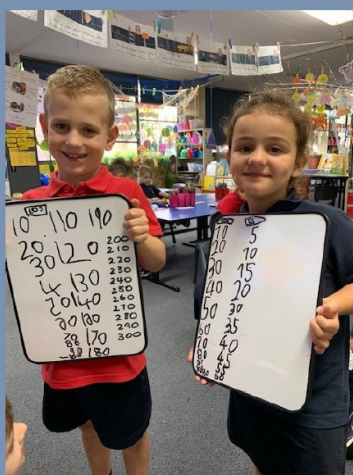

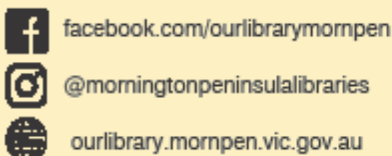


An exhibition reflecting on the life and legacy of Anne Frank during the Holocaust is introducing her story to a whole new generation and holds lessons still as powerful as ever.
