PRINCIPAL'S REPORT

Dear Parents/Carers

Once again welcome back to Mount Martha Primary School for 2022. I hope everyone had a very enjoyable and restful holiday! The COVID-19 pandemic has again set us some challenges to begin 2022 and we have some revised strategies to implement. It was wonderful to see how happy and enthusiastic the students were as they returned to school! The students have quickly settled in to their new classes. Organisation is a real focus for the first few days as students become familiar with the class and school routines. I am pleased with our very smooth start. On the first two pupil free days, staff updated training in management of anaphylaxis, allergies and asthma and also made the most of valuable curriculum planning and preparation time for the year ahead.

For 2022 we have new staff join Mount Martha Primary School. Welcome to Ms Tayla Howden, Mrs Victoria Rafeld, Ms Sheridan Cant, Miss Ellen Barry and Mr Nick Orchard. Meet The Teacher - Establishing a relationship and lines of communication with your child's teacher is an important part of their education. To assist this we are having two "Meet The Teacher" sessions. The first is on Tuesday 15th February for Years Four, Five and Six and Wednesday 16th February for Years Prep, One, Two and Three. Bookings will be via Compass. More information about the booking process is included in the newsletter.

COVID Information - We have started the year with some new strategies to follow. Strategies are included for your information. Thank you again for your assistance in their implementation.

Rapid Antigen Tests - Free rapid antigen tests have been distributed for twice weekly testing of students at home.

Twice-a-week testing is strongly recommended for both students and staff. Earlier detection decreases the potential for outbreaks and spreading of COVID-19 amongst students, families and staff. No specific days are prescribed but it may help if tests are done on the same days from week to week to build up a routine.

Tests are provided in packs of five individual tests. Tests for each child were distributed to parents/carers and students at the start of week one and another pack for each child will be provided at the start of week three. We will advise when available.

PRINCIPAL REPORT continued

Students and staff will do the tests at home; they only need to report their result if it is COVID-positive. They must report a COVID-positive result to:

- the school by phone or the RA Test Portal; this is so the school can support them, record that they will be absent while in seven-day isolation, and let the rest of the school community know there has been a positive case onsite and that they should monitor for symptoms
- the Department of Health via the <u>COVID-19 Positive Rapid Antigen Test Self-Reporting Form</u> or call centre on <u>1800 675 398</u>.

Information about how to do a test and how to read RAT results, including a how-to video translated into 33 languages, is available online.

Vaccination requirements

Parents and carers must have had two doses of a COVID-19 vaccine or have a valid medical exception (with limited exceptions) to enter school buildings.

All staff working in schools need to be fully vaccinated or have a verified medical exception.

COVID-19 vaccinations for students are not required for them to attend school but vaccination for students is highly encouraged. If your child has not yet had their first dose, please try to organise this as soon as possible. For more information on how to book a vaccination, including important information about vaccination for children aged 5 to 11, visit <u>Vaccination information for children and teenagers</u>.

Management of confirmed cases and household contacts at school

A 'suspected' or 'symptomatic' case means a person who displays any <u>COVID-19 symptoms</u>. Unwell students should <u>not</u> be sent to school or remain at school if symptoms appear during the day or they become unwell. Parents will be contacted to collect unwell students who will be supervised while isolated from other students. Parents/carers should complete a PCR or rapid antigen test.

- 1. If a <u>student</u> tests positive to COVID-19 (via a PCR or rapid antigen test) parents/carers should complete the <u>RA Test portal</u>. A parent/carer is also required to inform the school by phone or in writing.
- 2. Students who report a positive result must isolate for seven days and not attend school during that period.
- 3. Where a <u>student</u> is a <u>household contact</u> of a positive case (that is, they have spent more than four hours with someone who has COVID-19 inside a house, accommodation, or care facility) they must inform the school and isolate for seven days and not attend school during that period.
- 4. The school community will be notified via a Compass post when a student or staff member has (or multiple students or staff members have) returned a positive COVID-19 test result and had attended the school. The notification can be provided to only the affected group/cohort/year level or to the whole school as required. It repeats instructions for continued school attendance and quarantine requirements as necessary.
- 5. <u>Asymptomatic</u> students or staff who have been in contact with a COVID-19 case at school or work should continue to attend school and monitor for symptoms. <u>Symptomatic</u> students or staff must stay or return home and take a rapid antigen or PCR test. On receipt of a negative test result, and if well enough, the student/staff member can return to school.
- 6. <u>Students</u> should refrain from returning to school if they remain symptomatic, unless it is known that their symptoms are caused by an underlying health condition or medication.
- 7. Students and staff who have tested positive for COVID-19, have completed their 7 -day isolation period and are subsequently asymptomatic do not need to undertake surveillance testing for 30 days

Schools will treat health information, including an individual's vaccination status or diagnosed medical condition (including positive COVID-19 test results) in accordance with the Schools' Privacy Policy. COVID-19 diagnoses and vaccination statuses are not shared or discussed unless the individual (or their parent/carer) provides consent, or unless schools are legally obliged or authorised to do so (for example, to comply with a Pandemic Order).

Ventilation

We will also make sure that classrooms are well ventilated by opening windows and doors, to minimise the risk of infection. We have received air purifiers, which are being used around the school as an added safety measure. Outdoor learning spaces are also being used.

Other Vital COVIDSafe steps

Hygiene practices, mask wearing and social distancing will continue wherever possible in Term One. Visitors to school grounds must comply with density limits, face mask requirements, QR code/Compass Kiosk/manual check ins and practise respiratory etiquette and good hand hygiene.

Hygiene Practices

Teachers will implement strategies for students to wash/sanitise their hands each time upon entry and exit of rooms, before and after eating, after using the toilet and after coughing or sneezing. Students will be reminded of the need to cough or sneeze into their elbow and use tissues. All classrooms have handwashing and/or sanitiser available, tissues and antiseptic wipes. Parents may choose to supply their own child with sanitiser and tissues.

Face Masks

- School staff will be required to always wear masks indoors when not actively teaching or communicating with students. Masks are not compulsory for teachers and staff outdoors.
- Students in Year Three and above must wear a face mask indoors at school and Outside School Hours Care (OSHC) programs, unless
 a lawful exception applies. Students must wear face masks even if vaccinated. Students are not required to wear masks outside.
 Parent/carers of a student/s who meet the criteria for an exception should notify the school in writing for their child/ren to not wear
 a mask to the school.
- When attending outdoor school camps and excursions, face masks are not mandatory, unless physical distancing cannot be maintained. Face masks must continue to be worn when indoors on camps and excursions.
- Visitors to schools aged eight and above must wear a face mask in all indoor spaces, unless a lawful exception applies.
- Students in Prep to Year Two are strongly recommended to wear a face mask indoors at school or an OSHC program.

Social Distancing

It is recognised that social distancing is difficult for primary school aged children however where possible we will continue to minimise mixing between classes and year levels.

Visitors including parents/carers are required to continue to use the QR code check in, Compass kiosk or manual register to enter buildings. Social distancing is required maintaining a physical distance of 1.5 metres. Early pick up or late arrivals will be organised from the Office. Parents should be mindful of not congregating at the school gates and must practice social distancing.


MEET THE TEACHER SESSIONS


Bookings will open on Monday 7 February at 8am and will close on Monday 14 February at 2pm.

How to make a booking.

Parents can make bookings by clicking the 'Book Parent Teacher Interviews' button available next to their student's photo on their Compass homepage, or by clicking the Dashboard Alert at the top of their Newsfeed.



They will also have two options available - Start Booking Now, which allows them to immediately begin the booking process, or Show Me How To Book, which includes a walkthrough explaining how to book using Compass. This section is highlighted in blue in the image below. If parents have multiple students at the school they can toggle between the staff members their students are associated with using the dropdown menu available at the top right of the screen, which is highlighted in red in the image below.

INFORMATION FOR PARENTS

Every Victorian child should have access to the world of learning opportunities that exist beyond the classroom. The Camps, Sports and Excursions Fund helps ensure that no student will miss out on the opportunity to join their classmates for important, educational and fun activities. It is part of making Victoria the Education State and the Government's commitment to breaking the link between a student's background and their outcomes.

CAMPS, SPORTS & EXCURSIONS FUND (CSEF)

School camps provide children with inspiring experiences in the great outdoors. Excursions encourage a deeper understanding of how the world works while sports teach teamwork, discipline and leadership. All are a part of a healthy curriculum.

CSEF is provided by the Victorian Government to assist eligible families to cover the costs of school trips, camps and sporting activities.

If you hold a valid means-tested concession card or are a temporary foster parent, you may be eligible for CSEF. A special consideration category also exists for asylum seeker and refugee families. The allowance is paid to the school to use towards expenses relating to camps, excursions or sporting activities for the benefit of your child.

The annual CSEF amount per student is:

- \$125 for primary school students
- \$225 for secondary school students

HOW TO APPLY

New applicants should contact the school office to obtain a CSEF application form or download from the website below.

If you applied for CSEF at your child's school last year, you do not need to complete an application form this year unless there has been a change in your family circumstances.

You only need to complete an application form if any of the following changes have occurred:

- new student enrolments; your child has started or changed schools this year.
- changed family circumstances; such as a change of custody, change of name, concession card number, or new siblings commencing this year.

Check with the school office if you are unsure.
