Year Six Market - The market is coming up on Friday 8th September. For our Year Six students it is an activity that they really look forward to organising. The students (after sessions with the teachers) get together in groups and present their idea for a stall or activity to a panel (shark tank style). With support from the teachers, they ensure they have a mix of activities, food stalls and craft stalls. The school provides each group with seed funding for their stall. This cross-curriculum inquiry unit covers many areas of the Victorian Curriculum: Mathematics, English, Design and Technology, Economics and Business and the capabilities of Critical and Creative Thinking and Personal and Social. The students always do an amazing job running the market for all the students across the school to enjoy. We very much appreciate the support of the Year Six student's parents who behind the scenes are supporting the market. All students will have the opportunity to visit the market to purchase craft or food items and participate in lots of fun activities like "dunk the teacher." 

CASH FREE

This year the students will once again be using a 'token system' for payments on the day. This not only allows for safe payment, it also provides the school community with many rich learning tasks around money, budgeting and equity.

Here is how it works:

Students will be able to purchase a '\$15 Market Pack' via Compass. The Pack will be for a Sausage in Bread (or equivalent if diet doesn't permit), a juice and 20 tokens with a value of 50 cents per token. Students will be given these tokens and will use these at the various stalls. Simples!!

All activities, additional snacks and most craft will be either one, two or three tokens.

You will be able to purchase these Market Packs via 'Compass' shortly.

Handy Market Hints:

Frequently Asked Questions:

Q: What sort of prizes can be won?

A: Occasionally the prize is simply participating! For example, one stall allows you to "Dunk a Teacher"! What more could you ask for? Many other stalls have prizes ranging from things such as tattoos, basketballs and some great surprises!

Q: Can I purchase additional tokens.

A: No. Each year level will have the opportunity to visit the market for about one hour. The allocated number of tokens per Market Pack should be enough for them to enjoy throughout this time. Talk to your child about using two or three tokens to purchase a treat, three or four for a small item of craft and then to use the remaining tokens on their favourite five activities! 
