PRINCIPAL'S REPORT

National Reconciliation Week - During this week, teaching and learning activities in our classrooms and specialist lessons have focused on the theme for National Reconciliation Week 2023, "Be a Voice for Generations". Encouraging all Australians to be a voice for reconciliation in tangible ways in our everyday lives – where we live, work and socialize.

In acknowledgement of National Reconciliation Week, this Friday 2nd June the Student Representative Council (SRC) will be hosting a fundraising BBQ at 3.30pm after school. Sausages will be \$3 and Zooper Doopers will be \$1, and all funds will go towards the Willum Warrain Aboriginal Association Incorporated.

Willum Warrain ('home by the sea') Aboriginal Association is the voice of Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander people on the Mornington Peninsula. It is a gathering place where Aboriginal people come together to realize community aspirations and forge shared identity. Willum Warrain provides information and referral services, charitable support, health and wellbeing programs, art and culture programs, and links between the Aboriginal community and the broader local community. Their core focus is cultural strengthening.

The SRC have chosen to raise money to support the programs that Willum Warrain offer to Aboriginal children. The programs provide an important opportunity for young Aboriginal people to connect and share culture. According to Willum Warrain, for many of the children, it is the only time of the week when they can be strong Aboriginal youth surrounded by their mob.

Cheese Toastie Day today - With a burst of cold weather this week and Winter starting the Cheese Toastie Day was certainly very welcome! As you can imagine preparing over 550 cheese toasties requires a very good system and lots of dedicated helpers. Thank you, SEC, for coordinating the event! Thank you, parents, for your support. Social Events Committee have some more terrific events coming up please join them at their next meeting Tuesday 11th July at 7pm in the staff centre. Another great way to be involved in the school!






