PRINCIPAL'S REPORT

Book Day - We had a fabulous Book and Movie Character Dress-up Day on Tuesday with our hostesses Barbie and Barbie (aka Mrs Doye & Mrs Rafeld) kicking off the day with our annual Book Day Parade in the gym. All of our students were "dressed to impress" — clearly there had been many hours of effort put in at home, so well done and thank you to all MMPS families. Our teachers had lots of exciting book day learning activities organised for their classes and many students came down to the office to show us their excellent work. This is always a fun and exciting day for our school community and 2023 was no exception. Well done everyone.

Administration of Medication Policy - There are some students at school who need to take medication throughout the day. Whether temporarily as they recover from illness or alternatively, a more permanent arrangement where specific medication is required daily. A reminder for all parents of these students to please ensure that you have filled in a Medical Authority Form that can be accessed through the office. Any medication that is brought to school needs to be clearly labelled with the student's name, the dosage required and the time that the medication needs to be administered. Medication also needs to be within its expiry date. Rhonda, Louise and the team do a fabulous job of looking after our students in First Aid and I thank you in advance for supporting them with the correct documentation as required by the Department of Education.

Body Education - Our Year 5 and 6 students are in the middle of their Body Education sessions with the fabulous Kelly Nash. Kelly used to be a comedian and has the knack of being able to make those important discussions about growing bodies engaging, fun and a little bit light-hearted. Its been great to see the students embracing the sessions and showing interest in their own growth and development.

2024 Prep Transition - "Story Time Sessions"- The school is offering Story Time sessions as part of the transition program for our 2024 Preps. For many of our Preps it is their first introduction to primary school and is an important part of beginning to familiarise themselves with school. Year Six Market - The market is coming up on Friday 8th September. For our Year Six students it is an activity that they really look forward to organising. The students (after sessions with the teachers) get together in groups and present their idea for a stall or activity to a panel (shark tank style). With support from the teachers, they ensure they have a mix of activities, food stalls and craft stalls. The school provides each group with seed funding for their stall. This cross-curriculum inquiry unit covers many areas of the Victorian Curriculum: Mathematics, English, Design and Technology, Economics and Business and the capabilities of Critical and Creative Thinking and Personal and Social. The students always do an amazing job running the market for all the students across the school to enjoy. We very much appreciate the support of the Year Six students' parents who behind the scenes are supporting the market. All students will have the opportunity to visit the market to purchase craft or food items and participate in lots of fun activities like "dunk the teacher." App checklist for parents



Checklist

The aim of this checklist is to help you navigate the app world and give you the tools to ensure you and your family enjoy safe and positive online experiences.

Do your research

- . The eSafety Guide is a good starting point.
- Other sources include <u>Common Sense Media</u> and <u>ConnectSafely</u>, which review the most
- · Search for recent reviews from Google Play and Apple Store.
- · Discuss the benefits and risks with family or friends who use the app.

eSafety tip: Check whether the app can be used for content sharing, photo and video sharing. messaging and online chat, voice chat, video calling, live streaming, gaming, in-app purchasing, online relationships, location sharing and encryption.

Check the age rating and requirements

- Apps usually state a minimum age for users in their terms of use but they don't all have verification requirements.
- . The eSafety Guide includes the stated age for many popular apps.
- · Common Sense Media makes an independent assessment of provides age recommendations.
- . Check the advice on the eSafety Parent page Are they old enough?

eSafety tip: When deciding if an app is suitable for your child, think about their level of maturity and judgement as well as the age recommendation.

Consider privacy - read the terms and conditions and ask yourself these questions:

- · What information does the app request?
- Does the app provide privacy protections?
- Can you restrict who sees your profile?
- · Who can find you in a search?
- What information can people see about you?

ATTENDANCE NEWS - RECORDING YOUR CHILD'S ABSENCE

A friendly reminder to parents the preferred method of recording your child's absence is via Compass. To add an attendance note click on your child's picture then click absence.

Please ensure you record the note prior to the automated SMS being sent at 10.15am. If you happen to receive an SMS please add the reason for the absence immediately to let our school know your child is safe.

SAME-DAY NOTIFICATION OF UNEXPLAINED STUDENT ABSENCES

FACT SHEET FOR PARENTS/CARERS

If your child is sick or absent, you are required to notify their school as soon as possible **on the day of absence** using one of the following methods:

- 1. Online: log the absence directly using your school's IT platform.
- Telephone: the school office and let the staff know your child's name, class, date of absences and reason.
- Email: the school and provide the staff with your child's name, class, date of absences and reason

Notifying the school of your child's absence either prior to, or on the day that they will be away, helps ensure the safety and wellbeing of children and will fulfil your legal responsibility.

Why do I need to notify the school if my child is absent?

Schools need to know when and why a child is absent and you need to know if your child isn't at school.

From the end of Term 2 2018, all Victorian government schools are required to contact parents/carers as soon as practicable on the same day of an unexplained student absence. If your child is absent on a particular day and you have not contacted the school to explain why, the absence will be marked as unexplained.

This system also promotes daily school attendance. Going to school every day is the single most important part of your child's education, they learn new things every day – missing school puts them behind.

What is your responsibility?

You are legally required to ensure your child attends school every day or you must provide an explanation for their absence. You should let the school know in advance of any upcoming absences or let them know in the morning if your child won't be at school. In order for schools to implement the same day notification requirement, it's essential that you provide the school with your most up-to-date contact details.

Generally one notification will be sent per family. Should there be circumstances that require both parents and carers to be notified, please contact the school to make the necessary arrangements.

What is the school's responsibility?

The school must notify you of an unexplained absence in relation to your child as soon as practicable on the same day.

Where can I learn more about the process for managing student absences?

Ask your school for a copy of the Attendance Policy which outlines the school's processes and procedures for monitoring, recording and following-up of student absences.

Q: Can I purchase additional tokens.

Talk to your child about using two or three tokens to purchase a treat, three or four for a small item of craft and then to use the remaining tokens on their favourite five activities! 


