PRINCIPAL'S REPORT

End of Term - Term Two finishes tomorrow with a dismissal time of 2.30pm. Please note the early pick up time. Term 3 commences on Monday 12th July.

Congratulations to all our students for their flexibility in moving to remote learning and then returning to onsite learning. Thank you so much to families and staff for all your assistance and support this term as we have all had to respond once again to some significant challenges - education being just one!

Thank you also once again parents also for your assistance to limit transference of COVID-19 at school. We have some revised requirements around mask wearing and now the need for visitors to sign in using the QR code at entrances if entering buildings or use the Compass Kiosk in the Office. Recent localised outbreaks in other suburbs and states and subsequent containment measures including lockdowns and school closures remind us of how important these strategies are. Importantly we also have some eased restrictions at school with incursions, excursions, camps and interschool sport allowed albeit with some restrictions. They are listed in the "Updated COVID-19 Information" section of the newsletter.

End of Term Assembly - We will be having a whole school "End of Term" assembly on Friday 25th June commencing at 9.10am. We still have visitor density limits of 1 person: 4 square metres that apply to events in schools where visitors are in attendance. This results in us quickly exceeding our gym's capacity. Therefore, once again this assembly will be onsite for students and staff only. We will organise for this event to be livestreamed to our school community. More information has been sent via Compass this morning on how to access the livestream.

Mount Martha Village - The school has received a request from some of the traders in Mount Martha Village that students not go to the village directly after being dismissed for the end of term tomorrow. Social distancing concerns have been raised with the effect on other shoppers who may find it difficult to socially distance on the footpaths, the entrances to shops and inside the shops themselves. Thanks for your help.

Semester One Reports and Pupil Free Day Change of Date - A reminder that Semester One Student Reports will now be distributed via Compass on Monday 26th July. The Student Led Conference will now be on <u>Tuesday 27th July</u>. <u>Tuesday 27th July</u> is now the <u>Pupil Free Day</u>.

A program will be provided by Out of School Hours Care on Tuesday 27th July as usual for a Pupil Free Day. More information on booking is included in this newsletter.

UDPATED COVID-19 INFORMATION

A reminder to all parents of updated COVID-19 measures:

- Face masks **must** be carried and worn by individuals 12 years old or older when indoors. Masks remain recommended for outdoors where physical distancing of 1.5 metres cannot be maintained. Primary school students do not have to wear a mask but may choose to do so. For communication purposes, teachers and education support staff are not required to wear masks while teaching. Parents and visitors to school grounds must also observe face mask requirements.
- Parents are allowed to visit on site however social distancing (1.5 metre distance) between adults remains a
 key control measure and must continue to be practiced including when dropping off or picking up students.
 Visits should be for essential business. Please also avoid congregating at school gates to avoid congestion at
 entry and exit points.
- If you are required to enter buildings on school grounds, for whatever purpose, parents and visitors are now required to use the provided QR code check-in at building entrances. The Compass kiosk is also available in the Office foyer.
- Unwell students should <u>not</u> be sent to school or remain at school if symptoms (even mild symptoms) appear
 during the day or they become unwell. Parents will be contacted to collect unwell students who will be
 supervised while isolated from other students. Parents should follow the latest DHHS and medical
 practitioner advice as to testing and quarantining.
- The school will continue to practise strict hygiene protocols and enhanced school cleaning procedures are also in place.
- Drinking fountains are available but students may choose to bring their own named water bottle.
- Density limits do not apply in classrooms and other spaces students use. A density limit of 1 person to 4 square metres does apply to any spaces and activities being attended by staff, parents/carers and other visitors and then applies to all persons in the space including students, staff and visitors. This includes assemblies and other gatherings.
- Students and staff can attend assemblies in person. Other visitors access remotely.
- School playgrounds are open for use during and out of school hours.
- Excursions, incursions and interschool activities are now permitted with compliance with record keeping obligations and appropriate density limits.
- Indoor and outdoor interschool sport can proceed throughout Victoria, and outdoor and indoor contact and non-contact physical activity is permitted.
- School Camps can take place provided that if multiple schools are onsite the school groups remain separated and do not share common facilities at the same time.
- In the event of another outbreak, each family should regularly check the list of public exposure sites in Victoria (where a person with COVID-19 has attended), and if anyone in the family has attended a site at the times listed, follow the instructions given.



FIRST AID NEWS

Allergy and Anaphylaxis

We are asking your help to support the children in our school who are at risk of anaphylaxis.

Anaphylaxis is a severe allergic reaction that is potentially life threatening. Food allergies are the most common cause of anaphylaxis. There is no cure for food allergy, therefore avoidance of known food allergens is crucial.

Peanuts and tree nuts are the foods most likely to cause anaphylaxis (probably because the oily nature of nuts makes transference to other surfaces easier). However, in our school community we also have risk of anaphylaxis from raw egg, wheat, cow's milk, kiwi fruit, honey, sesame seeds, and crustaceans. Obviously it is not as easy to eliminate these items as they are in everything, so therefore hand washing after eating is critical. We also have issues with penicillin, lavender and dust mites.

The school is supporting children at risk of anaphylaxis by:

- training staff,
- encouraging children to wash their hands after eating,
- educating children about food allergies, and
- following our no food sharing policy.

We ask you to support children at risk of anaphylaxis by:

- not sending food with nuts or nut products to school.
- teaching your child not to share food with friends,
- encouraging your child to wash their hands after eating, and
- asking your child to get help immediately if their allergic schoolmate gets sick.

With your help we can provide a safe environment that meets the needs of all our children.


