FIRST AID NEWS

CHICKEN POX

Several cases of Chicken Pox have been reported within the School Community. Chicken Pox generally presents with a low-grade fever, lack of energy and a rash which then transforms into blisters. Children must be kept home from school until all blisters have dried. Please be aware that children who have been immunised against Chicken Pox may still contract a milder form of the disease.

HEAD LICE

We are having a real problem with head lice at the moment. Could you please check your child's hair for live eggs or lice?

There are two choices of treatment:

<u>Non-chemical</u>: Use conditioner and comb with a head lice comb to remove the head lice and eggs and repeat every 2 days until no live lice have been found for 10 days.

Chemical: Treat and comb with a head lice comb to remove the head lice and eggs; and repeat in 7 days.

The conditioner and comb method is very successful and less harsh on children's heads. For prevention of further outbreaks, leave a head lice comb in the shower and comb through the conditioner once a week while washing your hair. Head lice take 14 - 17 days to mature so if you continue to comb each week you will remove the lice before they are able to lay more eggs and thus break the cycle.

Another important step to prevent head lice is to ensure all hair that is shoulder length or longer is tied back as per the MMPS Uniform Policy. As head lice do not fly or jump, they only crawl, it is only direct hair to hair contact that allows transference. By tying hair back this minimises the risk of head lice infestation.

Dear Parents and Carers,

A key focus of the Be You initiative and the Child Safe Standards framework, is to support students in developing the knowledge and strategies to keep themselves safe in a range of situations. In Term Three of each year, our school has made a commitment to teaching the Primary Protective Behaviours Program across all year levels, to ensure that all students understand how to recognise and respond to unsafe situations.

The aim of the Primary Protective Behaviours program is:

- To help protect children and young people because we cannot be with them every minute of the day.
- To give children and adults permission to talk about problems or difficult situations they face.
- To empower children with the right to feel safe and act to keep themselves safe.
- To help students to understand that threats to their safety do not necessarily come from strangers.
- To provide a safe way of talking about acceptable and unacceptable verbal and physical contact.

The program strategies can provide the basis for helping children to be safe at school and address problems such as bullying. It can also help everyone learn to stay safe from the risks that surround us in everyday life.

The program focus is on everyone Feeling safe, Being Safe and Talking about it. The program is based on two themes:

- We all have the right to feel safe all of the time.
- Nothing is so awful that we can't talk about it with someone.

In conjunction with the two themes are the three major concepts of the program:

SAFETY - an individual feeling and a basic right for every person

EARLY WARNING SIGNS – specific physical indicators that alert us to possible risks to our safety NETWORKING – identifying people to talk to and developing communication skills.

Students will learn to be PERSISTENT and to keep asking for help until they feel safe again.

In the You Can Do It program we will also be focusing on 'Wellbeing, Resilience and Happiness' next term

Read More in May Award Winners


