PRINCIPAL'S REPORT

Welcome - A huge welcome to Arlo in Prep and his family who are joining our school community.

COVID - To ensure the safety and well-being of staff and students, the Victorian Government will continue to provide schools with Rapid Antigen Tests in Term 3 and Term 4 2022.

Updated policy requires the tests to be used by students **when symptomatic** or considered to be a **household contact** of a positive case (that is, they have spent more than 4 hours with someone who has COVID-19 inside a house).

For your convenience, RAT test packs will now be available for collection from the First Aid Office at the school throughout Term 3 and Term 4 for use by staff and students who are symptomatic or who are household contacts. We will no longer be sending home boxes with each student on a fortnightly basis. You can ring the office on 03 5974 2800 and request a RAT test packs to be sent home with your child/children. We understand that some families have used the test kits sent home and have others that currently do not require anymore.

The Department of Health strongly recommends that face masks are worn in indoor settings. Face masks are mandatory for those aged 8 and over who are household contacts and attending school. This is because wearing a mask is effective in reducing the transmission of COVID-19. Face masks are strongly recommended for staff and students aged 8 and over when indoors but are not required. Schools will not sanction students or staff who do not wear masks, but the Department of Education has requested we encourage students to understand the benefits of wearing a mask to protect themselves and their school community.

Story Dogs Fundraiser - For the past four years our school has been fortunate to be involved in the Story Dogs Program. We have two amazing volunteers Sandra and Suzanne and their gorgeous dogs Paddy and Benny. Story Dogs is a fun and unique reading support program that improves children's reading and communication skills by children reading to a trained companion dog and its handler. Story Dogs partners with schools to provide a reading support service free of any charge. However, to ensure the continuation of the program and allow them to train more handlers and dogs requires funding. Our Student Representative Council (SRC) have decided they would like to raise funds to support more dogs to be trained to support children in primary schools. On Friday August 5th we will be having a Free Dress Day so come dressed as a teacher with a gold coin donation. After school there will be a sausage sizzle. More details in the newsletter.

SEC - The Social Event Committees next meeting is next Tuesday 2nd August at 7pm. The SEC have decided that this meeting will be a Webex meeting. I will send the link to all parents in a Compass post on Monday. The committee will discuss the coming events including the Father's Day Breakfast. More details to come next week. The team would be delighted if you would like to log in and find out about exciting activities to connect all members of our school community.

BODY EDUCATION NEWS



Body Education with Kelly Nash

Dear Parents/Carers.

Mt Martha P.S. is offering families a **Body Education Program** on the evening of **Tuesday August 16th**.

The programs offered aim to support parents in helping their children learn about aspects of human sexuality. These entertaining and educational sessions are between 45- 60 mins in length and present a valuable opportunity to discuss a variety of subjects in a safe and supported environment.

Price: \$20 per family for one session \$25 per family for both sessions

The Sessions:

5.45-6.30pm Years 1 & 2 - A session to help children understand families and bodies, what makes them the same and what makes them different.

Age appropriate language is used to help children understand the differences in families and body parts. How Bodies can be the same and they can be different. We talk about private parts and what being "private" means. Students are reminded that private parts are for private places. We also discuss feeling safe in our bodies and identify who we could talk to if we weren't feeling safe. Families are given the opportunity to discuss how babies develop and how they are born. (This session would not include sexual intercourse but would include introducing the terms egg and sperm).

6.45- 7.45pm Years 3 & 4 - A session to help children understand difference in families and bodies and how differences can make human reproduction possible.

This session begins by also acknowledging that families, like bodies, have similarities and differences. In this session we go on to name parts of the body that are the same and different. Similarly to the above session, we have a short discussion on understanding private parts and the rights and responsibilities we have around respecting everyone's bodily autonomy. From there, conception (including sexual intercourse and a brief and basic explanation of assisted reproduction) is explained and then a discussion of foetal development and birth.

About Kelly Nash:

Kelly has worked with the Mt Martha Primary School community for nearly 10 years assisting with the sexuality education component of the curriculum that is part of the *Health and Physical Education* domain. Kelly trained as a teacher in the 1980's (so it's probably just as well she has decided on Sexuality Education and not Fashion Education!).

After many years working in schools as a teacher and in health promotion, including 3 years with the Royal Women's Hospital health promotion unit and 7 years with Family Life Victoria, Kelly started her own body/sexuality education business. Kelly's aim is to create a relaxed and inclusive environment where her unique and fun facilitation style allows informal, respectful learning to young people so that they may be empowered with knowledge and understanding about their bodies, her greatest hope is that she is able to support the children's families in this important part of their education.

Kelly has WWCC and offers Family Evenings and School Programs for Primary schools that cover sexuality education and she offers Positive Body Image workshops for Secondary Schools.
