PRINCIPAL'S REPORT

We've had another busy week here at Mount Martha Primary School as our students have engaged with lots of different learning and extracurricular activities. Our Year 3s took their multicultural inquiry unit offsite where they immersed themselves in the vibrant, cosmopolitan atmosphere of the Dandenong Market. They were introduced to a world of new tastes and flavours that many had not seen before and learnt about the history of the market and its cultural significance. Our Year 5s and 6s continued with the Body Education Program and some classes filmed their movie with Bruce as they prepare for the Year 5 & 6 Film Festival in Term 4. It's been wonderful to see such creative costuming, make up and props and we'd like to thank families at home for supporting classroom teachers to get ready for their movie experience.

2023 Parent Opinion Survey - We are nearing the closing date for our Parent Opinion Survey and invite all those families who have not yet completed the survey, to do so as soon as possible. Areas of strengths and those that require further improvement with be reported to the school community when all data is received from Department of Education.

Year Six Market - We are very excited about the market that is coming up on Friday 8th September. For our Year Six students it is an activity that they really look forward to organising. The students (after sessions with the teachers) get together in groups and present their idea for a stall or activity to a panel (shark tank style). With support from the teachers, they ensure they have a mix of activities, food stalls and craft stalls. The school provides each group with seed funding for their stall. This cross-curriculum inquiry unit covers many areas of the Victorian Curriculum: Mathematics, English, Design and Technology, Economics and Business and the capabilities of Critical and Creative Thinking and Personal and Social. The students always do an amazing job running the market for all the students across the school to enjoy. We very much appreciate the support of the Year Six students' parents who behind the scenes are supporting the market. All students will have the opportunity to visit the market to purchase craft or food items and participate in lots of fun activities like "dunk the teacher." All families should now have received a notification through a Compass post on how to purchase the vouchers for the day. Further information is contained in the newsletter.



Dear parents and friends,

The Year 6 students are holding their Market Day on Friday 8th September. This market is run as a fun activity for the students within the school community, to fundraise for the 'Royal Childrens Hospital, to help fund the Year 6 Graduation Celebration, as well as providing a pledge to our school.

Students have worked exceptionally hard to create a fun and exciting atmosphere for all the Mount Martha Primary School students. They have developed business plans, created names and logos, considered pricing and worked hard to gather sponsorship and donations from local businesses and organisations. A lot of cooking, craft and game development has also occurred to ensure all of our students enjoy the day.

To ensure the success of the day, the Year 6 students require the support of the Mount Martha School community.

On the day all students are invited to dress up in casual clothes for a gold coin donation.

A wide range of stalls have been organised by the Year 6 students for the day. Prices range from 1 token (50 cents) through to 4 tokens (\$2). The Market will run between 10:30am - 1pm and every student will have the opportunity to visit during this time.

A reminder that the Year 6 Market 2023 will be a cash free event. To allow your child access to the amazing things on offer, you are able to purchase a \$15 Market Pack on Compass. The Market Pack gives students lunch (sausage, bread and a drink) and 20 Tokens (\$10 worth). The allocated amount of tokens per Market Pack should be enough for them to enjoy throughout the day. Please talk to your child about using some tokens to purchase a treat, some to purchase a small item of craft and then to use the remaining tokens on their favourite activities!

App checklist for parents



Checklist

The aim of this checklist is to help you navigate the app world and give you the tools to ensure you and your family enjoy safe and positive online experiences.

Do your research

- . The eSafety Guide is a good starting point.
- Other sources include <u>Common Sense Media</u> and <u>ConnectSafely</u>, which review the most
- · Search for recent reviews from Google Play and Apple Store.
- · Discuss the benefits and risks with family or friends who use the app.

eSafety tip: Check whether the app can be used for content sharing, photo and video sharing. messaging and online chat, voice chat, video calling, live streaming, gaming, in-app purchasing, online relationships, location sharing and encryption.

Check the age rating and requirements

- Apps usually state a minimum age for users in their terms of use but they don't all have verification requirements.
- . The eSafety Guide includes the stated age for many popular apps.
- · Common Sense Media makes an independent assessment of provides age recommendations.
- . Check the advice on the eSafety Parent page Are they old enough?

eSafety tip: When deciding if an app is suitable for your child, think about their level of maturity and judgement as well as the age recommendation.

Consider privacy - read the terms and conditions and ask yourself these questions:

- · What information does the app request?
- Does the app provide privacy protections?
- Can you restrict who sees your profile?
- · Who can find you in a search?
- What information can people see about you?






