This is also the federal election day and SEC will be running a fundraising BBQ. Hope to see you there to vote, buy a sausage and assist with the Working Bee!

Pupil Free Days - For your diaries. This term Semester One reports are prepared by teachers and distributed to parents. On **Tuesday 21st June** we hold our Student Led Conferences. At these conferences students reflect on and present their learning to their parents and their teacher. Times are booked like our "Meet the Teacher Evening". **This is a Pupil Free Day** with students only required to attend at the time they are doing their presentation. More details to come on booking a time.

This term we also have a second <u>Pupil Free Day</u> on <u>Friday 27th May.</u> The Department of Education recently reached an in-principle agreement with unions, as bargaining representatives of employees in the Victorian Teaching Service, on a proposed replacement enterprise agreement that will apply to teaching service employees (eligible employees). Teachers will be entitled to three professional practice days in 2022, starting in Term 2, 2022. For Term 2, 2022 only, the Department recommends schools hold their first professional practice day on the same day for all staff. This will support effective and efficient use of the day and alleviate any workforce pressures. Students will therefore not be required to attend school on this day.

Gillian and her team will run Out of Hours School Care Program on both these days.

At MMPS our school vision states; Mt Martha Primary School strives to empower students to be active learners who make a positive impact in a changing world. To achieve this, as many are aware, Mount Martha Primary School expects 4 core values from each child. Knowledge, Integrity, Collaboration and Respect underpin the work done to empower students to make positive change. Teachers and students have been renewing our focus on teaching and displaying these core values in everything that we do.

For the next 4 weeks I will focus on one of these values to let you know the expectations from school, as well as what each value looks like at school, how we have defined them in student friendly language and what you can do to help keep the conversation going at home.

Each value comes with a set of expectations that we have of every child. These expectations are written in the same wording for each year level from Prep - Year Six however the exact nature of the expectation changes as students progress through the school.

As part of the renewed focus on our school values teachers have been on the lookout for students that have been demonstrating our values in the yard. Students that are caught demonstrating one or more of our values are acknowledged with a little card to reinforce the importance of showing our school values at all times. If your student brings one of these cards home please take the time to ask exactly what they were seen to be doing to earn their card.

Next week I will dive into integrity and what exactly it means to us at MMPS but for now I will include each of the school values and their definitions below. These definitions were discussed, devised, and deliberated by staff over many hours to make sure that they were both comprehensive and easy to understand. While they may seem a bit wordy and perhaps too complicated for younger students to understand, the teaching and learning that go on in support of the definition bring understanding to each year level.

<u>Respect</u> is appreciating everyone's differences by understanding how words and actions affect the world, ourselves and others.

Integrity is doing the right thing in the right way at all times, even if it is hard or no one is looking.
 Collaboration is working, growing, learning and playing together, towards a common goal.
 Knowledge is information and experiences that allow us to understand the world, ourselves and others.
 Learning is lifelong.

Ask your student what they already know about these values and how they might go about showing these values at school.


