DUE DATE: 3 DECEMBER 2022

- All Packs will be **Home Delivered** to your nominated delivery address during December/January.
- Orders **must be placed by the due date** in order to guarantee delivery before the first day of Term 1.
- Orders placed after the due date **may not be processed until early February** due to our extremely busy schedule in January.
We will do our best to deliver your order in time, but is only **guaranteed** if placed by the due date. We apologise if you are a new enrollment or missed the due date due to unavoidable circumstances but the school is aware your pack may not be ready on the first day of school, so your child should not be disadvantaged.
- A packaging and delivery charge of \$8 is included in the cost of the pack. Orders placed after the due date will incur an additional \$8 late fee.
- Complete packs only can be ordered through Paperchase. We do not have a walk-in shop and individual items cannot be purchased. All orders must be placed online.

Please note our delivery drivers cannot deliver to PO Boxes - a physical address is required.

AUTHORITY TO LEAVE will automatically apply to all orders

If you have particular requirements - e.g. are away on holidays for a specific period, or have a particular place you'd like the parcel left, please note this in the Order Instructions/Notes section on the checkout page.

Thunderstorm asthma — be prepared this pollen season

Grass pollen season, which runs from October to December each year, brings an increase in asthma and hay fever symptoms. It also increases the risk of [thunderstorm asthma](#). For people with asthma or hay fever, especially those who experience wheezing or coughing with their hay fever, thunderstorm asthma can be sudden, serious and even life threatening.

Mount Martha Primary School will implement a range of measures to keep our school community safe when the risk of thunderstorm asthma increases.

Many of our staff are trained in asthma first aid, and we will monitor the VicEmergency app to receive thunderstorm warnings, and, where appropriate, keep students indoors when weather forecasts identify greater level of risk.

How you can prepare

During pollen season, there are some things you can do to prepare and protect yourself and your family:

- If your child has ever had asthma: talk to your doctor about what you can do to help protect your child from the risk of thunderstorm asthma, including updating your asthma action plan. Taking an asthma preventer properly and regularly is key to preventing asthma, including thunderstorm asthma.
- If your child has hay fever: see your pharmacist or doctor for a hay fever treatment plan and check if you should have an asthma reliever puffer. These are available from a pharmacy without a prescription.
- If your child has hay fever and experiences wheezing and coughing: it is important to make sure they don't also have asthma. Speak to your doctor about an asthma action plan.
- Where possible, avoid being outside during thunderstorms from October to December, especially during the wind gusts that come before the storm. Go inside and close your doors and windows. If you have your air conditioning on, turn it to 'recirculate'.

Protect yourself this pollen season – managing asthma and allergies matters.

Remain vigilant for COVID-19

It is important for students to manage any hay fever or asthma symptoms, as these conditions can produce symptoms such as fever, chills, cough, sore throat, shortness of breath, runny nose, and loss or change to sense of smell or taste, which are similar to COVID-19 symptoms.

If your child experiences these symptoms in different or worse ways to their usual hay fever or asthma symptoms, medical advice should be sought.

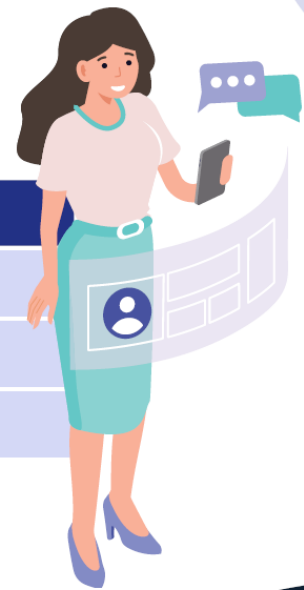

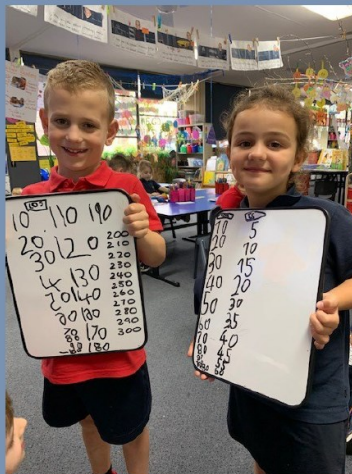

Libraries support dyslexic readers

Mornington Peninsula Libraries' supports a love of reading and lifelong learning by making dyslexic-friendly books even easier to find on the library shelves.

Just look for the blue stickers on the spines of books in the Junior Fiction section of your library to discover a new world of books designed specifically for those with dyslexia.

These books include special fonts that make text clearer to read and assist with letter confusion. They also incorporate thicker and tinted paper with more accessible layouts, aiding with visual distress and can help readers focus on meaning instead of sounding out each letter individually.

The library's free BorrowBox app can also be adapted for easier comprehension such as changing the font, text size and background colour of the eBooks.



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
