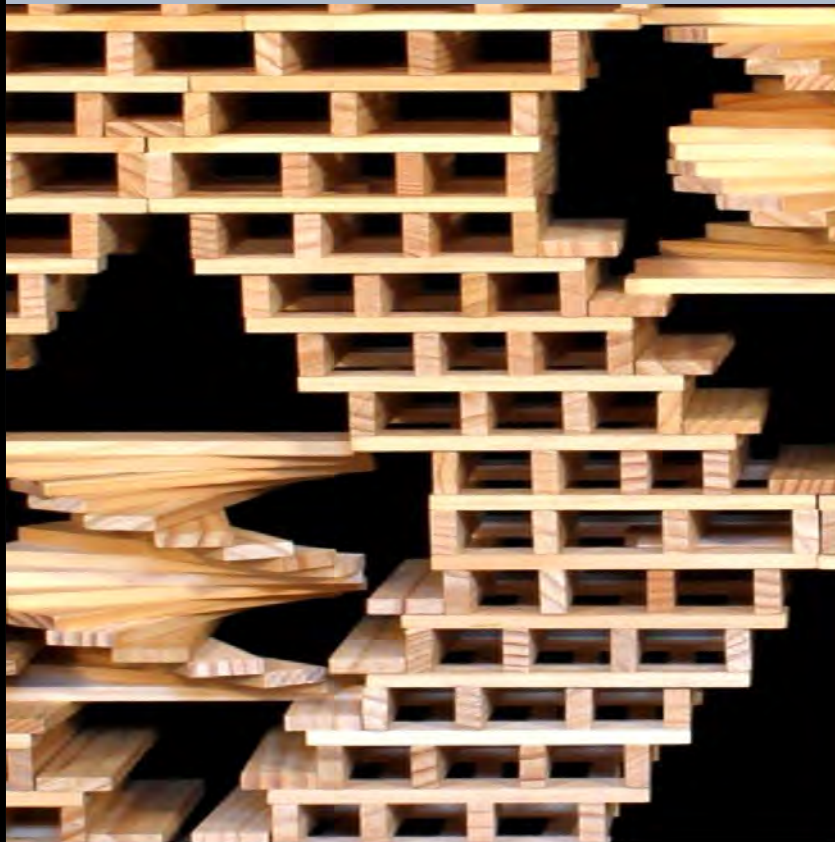

'I sea, I care' Ambassadors

Supporting children's social development

Suggestions for parents and carers

Family relationships and expectations have a major influence on children's social development.

The quality of relationship within the family, particularly those between parents, carers and children, sets the foundation for children to relate to others. Children also learn how to manage relationships by observing the ways that parents, carers and other family members relate to others.

How parents and carers can help:

- **Teach social and emotional skills**

Teach children social skills such as listening to others, taking turns, making friends and resolving conflict. Emphasise skills for cooperative and respectful relationships and acknowledge children's efforts to use them. For ideas about how you can teach social and emotional skills see the range of KidsMatter Primary resources on social and emotional learning.

- **Use positive discipline**

Setting reasonable expectations for children's behaviour, and communicating them clearly and respectfully, sets the tone for cooperation. Being consistent and positive in your approach to discipline communicates to children that they are valued, even if a particular behaviour is not. For further ideas see the KidsMatter Primary resources on Effective discipline.

- **Talk about values**

Read stories that emphasise moral values with your children. Ask their opinions on whether they think a particular action is respectful, responsible, caring etc. Discuss the pros and cons of different kinds of

values for promoting effective social relationships. Make talking about values and opinions part of everyday conversation, for example by talking about things you see on TV.

- **Capitalise on 'teachable moments'**

When something happens that requires a moral response it presents a 'teachable moment'. Ask children to think about what the problem is and what they could do to improve the situation. For example, when feelings have been hurt you could ask your child's opinion of what the person might be feeling hurt about. Extend your child's thinking through asking questions like, "How could you find out what Jo is feeling sad about?" and "What do you think you could do to help?"

- **Involve children in family discussions and decision making**

Encouraging children to contribute to family discussions and decision-making gives them practice in listening to others' views and seeing things from different angles. Listening and contributing to family discussions helps children understand what your values are and shows them that

their voices are valued. Involving children in these ways in family discussions and decision making promotes respectful and responsible behaviours.

- **Promote a strong sense of identity**

When parents and carers notice and acknowledge what children do to help, it shows children that their contributions are worthwhile. This gives them a sense of pride and encourages them to 'do the right thing'. Help children to work out ways to stand up for what they believe in and let them know that you are proud of them when they do. This helps children to build confidence in their own strengths and values.

- **Supervise media use**

When children are repeatedly exposed to violent or inappropriate media images it encourages them to see these things as normal. Children do imitate the behaviour they see on TV or on the internet. It is very important for parents and carers to supervise children's media use and ensure that the things they view are appropriate for their age and level of understanding.

FIRST AID NEWS

Head Lice Whole School Approach

Head lice are still around so we have designated the holidays for a whole school approach to the problem. Please check your child's hair for live eggs or lice. Should you find any, there are two choices of treatment:

Chemical: Treat and comb with a head lice comb to remove the head lice and eggs; and repeat in 7 days.

Non-chemical: Use conditioner and comb with a head lice comb to remove the head lice and eggs and repeat every 2 days until no live lice have been found for 10 days.

Head lice need 14 - 17 days to mature to egg laying stage, so if you leave a comb in the shower or bath and comb through the conditioner when you wash your hair each week, you will remove the lice before they are able to lay more eggs and we would soon be rid of this itchy problem.

As per the School Uniform Policy 'For health and safety reasons hair that is shoulder length or longer will be tied back.' As head lice don't jump or fly this will definitely help with stopping the spread of head lice.
